<u>Title I</u>

Welcome from the Title room 1 am thrilled to have the opportunity to rejoin the Weston family through the Title program.

<u>But what is Title?</u> Title is a supplemental, federally funded program which provides interventions in reading and math. Our Title program includes kindergarten through third graders. Students are selected based on assessment data collected in the beginning and middle of the school year. If chosen, your child receives 30 minutes of intense instruction which addresses gaps within their learning from a certified teacher and/or assistant. This year the Title staff includes <u>Mrs. Morley</u> and <u>Mrs. Clark</u>

Mrs. Julie Morley has taught for over fifteen years within Michigan and Indiana for grades prek through fifth grade. During this time, she has taught first grade, kindergarten, remediation and gifted programs in rural and urban settings. I have experience teaching grades 1, 2, and 3, and love seeing our students' smiling faces every day! My role involves traveling to multiple buildings to work with teachers and students to nurture the best reading environment possible! Adjusting back to school after summer break can be difficult, so how can we encourage our students to gear up for reading?

- ★ Help your child choose high interest books that involve topics your child enjoys learning about.
- ★ Try shared reading (you read a page, your child reads a page) if the text is challenging.
- ★ Ask your child what he or she is reading during the school day.
- ★ Set aside a designated time to read with your child. Children love to be read to! Sharing this experience with your child will emphasize the importance of reading while spending quality time together.
